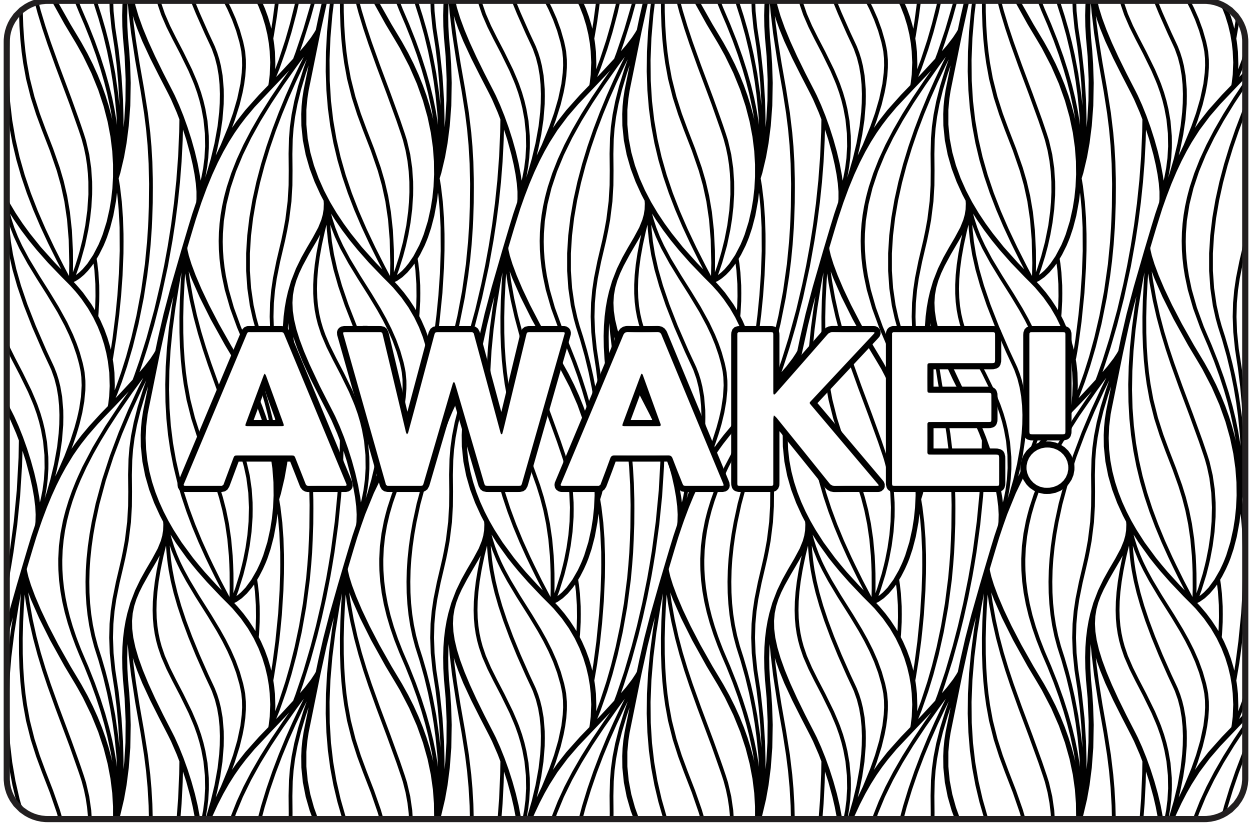

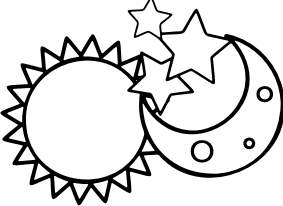
Translation Station

Hidden Picture

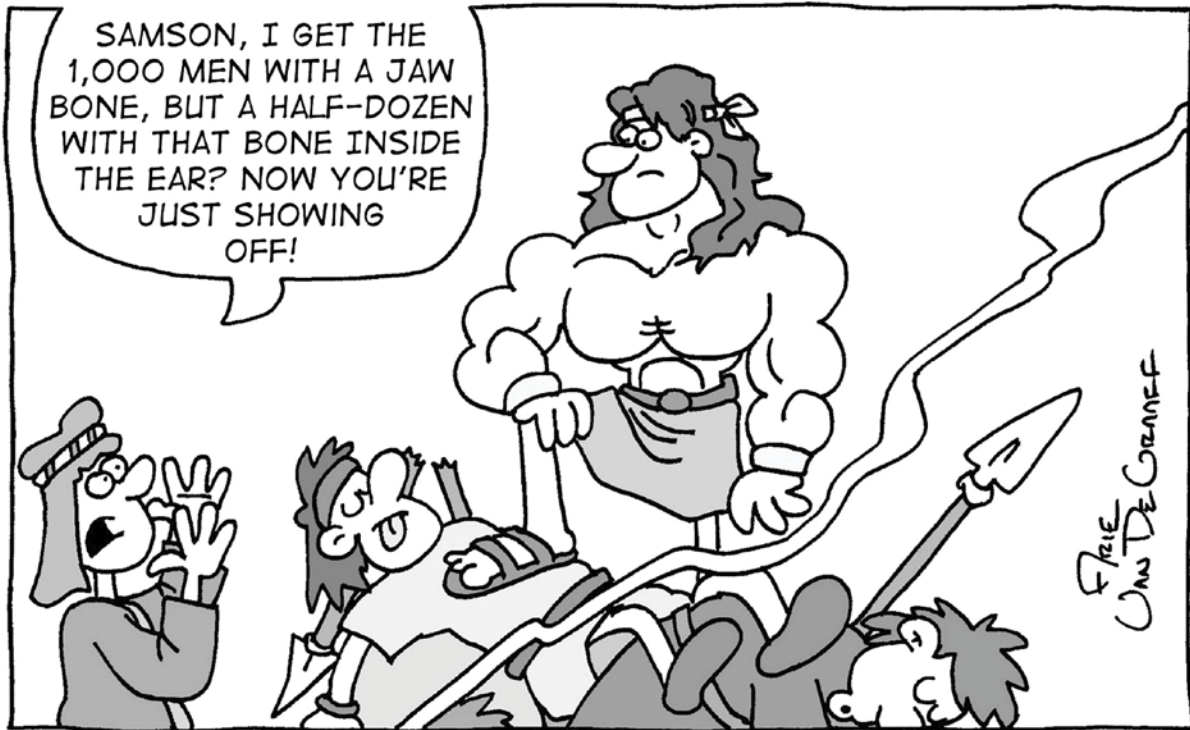

The Lord invites me to “put on (my) strength.”

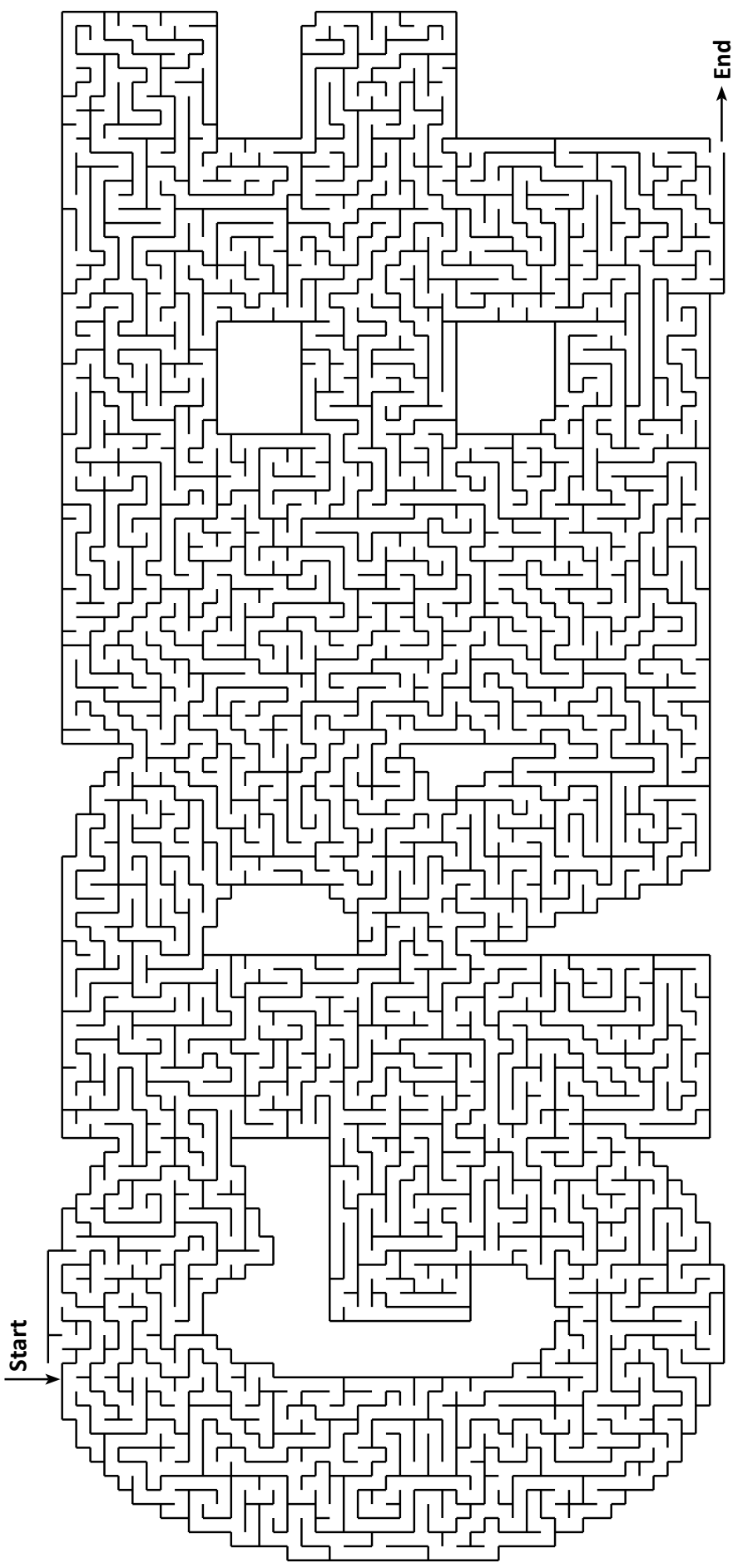

He is despised and rejected of men; a man of sorrows, and acquainted with grief: and we hid as it were our faces from him; he was despised, and we esteemed him not.



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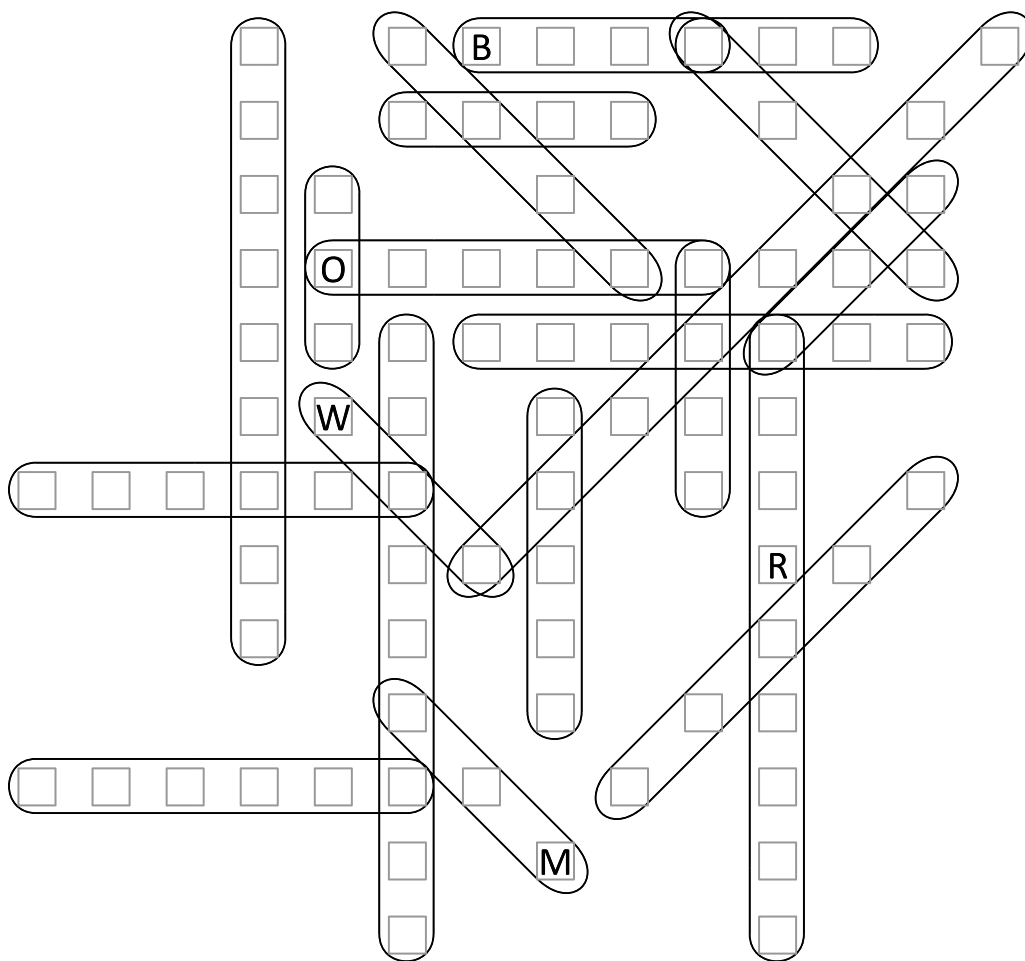
